The 2010 Ohio QSO Party

Late August once again brought out the ham radio activity in the Buckeye state, with record setting turnout and activity for the 2010 Ohio QSO Party. To the numbers:

By comparison, in 2009 there were 219 entries and 33,502 QSOs reported. The 2010 QSO total was nearly double that of 2007, a year marked by poor propagation and heavy QRN.

Much of the increase was in 75 meter SSB activity, as Ohio station figured out the if you can't beat 40 meters, go somewhere else. While this year there were some short periods of 40 meter propagation within Ohio, now that solar activity is on the increase hopefully that will be more common in 2011 and future years.

All Ohio counties were activated on both modes. Overall the least worked county, Pickaway, still had 40 QSOs. Only five counties had single digit totals on a given mode - Morgan on CW; and Holmes, Wyandot, Paulding, and Pickaway on SSB.

From outside Ohio, Pennsylvania was the most worked state. At the other end of the list, no QSOs were reported with Prince Edward Island or Newfoundland and Labrador.

Much credit for the increased activity goes to Ken Silverman, K2KW. Those of you in Ohio likely heard from Ken as part of his exceptional efforts to promote activity in the OhQP. It is therefore fitting that K2KW, operating as K8O from N0FW's station in Butler county, is the winner in the Single Operator High Power category. In the process he also set a new OhQP record for that category.

Ken won in a very tight race with last year's SOHP winner, Bob Hayes, KW8N, in Lorain county. Bob had more QSOs and multipliers than K8O, but Ken's strong CW showing was the key to his win. KW8N still gets a plaque for his efforts, by turning in the top single operator SSB effort.

Bob Liddy, K8BL, took the top honors in the Single Operator Low Power category from Lake county.

Tom Hain, KV8Q, spent the whole time operating CW from his Columbus QTH, and was rewarded by winning the plaque for the top single operator CW score.

In the QRP category, Hank Greeb, N8XX, formerly from Cincinnati and now living in Michigan, came down to set up a portable operation as N8Q from the village park in McClure in rare Henry county. Hank takes home a plaque for his category winning effort.

Once again AD8J and W3NO ventured west from Pittsburgh to help WA3C activate his Jefferson county station as K8T to win the Multioperator category. Since then AD8J has retired to North Carolina. While we hope he might make the return trip in 2011, there may well be an opening for a new challenger in the class.

Sharon Martarello, KJ8F, achieved a threepeat by once again winning the YL plaque from Allen county.

Hal Offutt, W1NN, pulled off something of an upset in the Mobile category by winning that plaque as a single operator, without a driver. Hal operates from fewer counties than the typical mobile, spending much of his time operating while parked. This year a great SSB multiplier total, largely from an unusually good SSB run from Seneca county, was enough to put him over the top.

Jim Stahl, K8MR, with John Bostwick, AC8E, usually mobile competitors, this year while driving around eastern Ohio, put down temporary roots in rare Monroe and Carroll counties to put them into the Rover category, in which they took home top honors.

In the Ohio Club competition, the Delaware Amateur Radio Association easily won the category, in the process smashing the existing club record.

From outside Ohio, Paul Newberry, N4PN, of Macon, Georgia, once again has the top score. His effort was the first time an out of state station has broken the 400 QSO mark in OhQP. However a higher proportion of SSB QSOs and two fewer multipliers left him 2000 points short of breaking his existing OhQP out of state record from 2006.

Steve Woods, NA4K, won the single operator low power category from Tennessee. Completing an out of state sweep from the southeast, in the QRP category another Tennessean, Jules Fazekas, N2WN, took home top honors.

Alan Brubaker, KO7X, made many OhQP operators happy with the Wyoming multiplier, and in doing so he won the plaque for the top station from the Mountain/Pacific time zones.

A new DX record was set by Uli Ann, DL2HBX, operating from DF9LJ's excellent station. Uli is no stranger to Ohio or the OhQP. He recently spent 5 years living in Michigan where he held the call KK8I. While Uli lived in W8-land he did two mobile trips to Ohio for the OhQP, including winning the mobile category in 2006 as part of the K8BB team.

Led by N4PN, the Southeast Contest Club won the out of state club category, with the Tennessee Contest Group in a strong second place.

The Mad River Radio Club, sponsor of the OhQP, thanks all who participated from both inside and outside Ohio. Special thanks are in order to those who made a special trip from outside the state to operate, often activating rare counties. Among these are groups from Indiana (the N9FN rover group), Wisconsin (W9MSE, who does have family in the Canton area), Maryland (K3TN of the K8SV mobile team), Pennsylvania (W3AG/R and those in the K8T effort), Tennessee (WO4O who operated the

Dayton ARA club station, W8BI), and Michigan (N8XX/N8Q), as well as several mobiles: N8SS, K8UNS, and K8DD. Sadly the trip for Hank Kohl, K8DD, was his last. Hank, a long time MRRC member and active participant in past Michigan and Ohio QSO Parties, passed away on November 13, at the much too early age of 67.

The Ohio QSO Party is made possible by the efforts of all who get on the air and make QSOs. But we'd like to recognize those behind the scene people who put it all together. As mentioned earlier, Ken, K2KW did a great job of publicizing the OhQP and stirring up interest around the state. Gary, AF8A, and Jim, K8MR, did the collecting and preprocessing of the received logs. Dave, K8CC, was the checker of the logs. Everett, WZ8P, is the maker of the beautiful OhQP plaques. And it was K8MR, the OhQP Chairman, who did the write up.

As always, the Ohio QSO Party is held on the 4th Saturday of August, which for the next few years is also the last Saturday of the month. Mark August 27, 2011, on your calendars for the next one. We hope to see you all again, and next time bring along a few friends as well.
