

The 2012 Ohio QSO Party

Once again the last weekend of August provided Ohio hams the opportunity to take to the airwaves to greet each other as well as hams around the world in the Ohio QSO Party. Good weather made for good outings for many, whether by driving around the Buckeye state, finding a new location in a possibly rare county, or just firing up the rig at home. To the numbers:

Activity was down somewhat from 2011's record, but still lots of people showed up. All 88 Ohio counties were represented; 87 counties were active on each mode, with the often rare Auglaize county missing on phone, and Licking, well represented on phone, but MIA for CW activity. Overall Monroe was the rarest, with 15 qsos reported in other logs. Canada's Prince Edward Island was the only totally missing multiplier from outside Ohio. Neighbors Michigan and Pennsylvania were the most active states.

Seven stations worked more than 80 Ohio counties, with rover N9FN catching 85, a new high water mark. They missed Brown, Henry, and Jackson. Of those seven stations, four missed Auglaize and Knox; three missed Monroe and Jackson; and two missed Belmont and Ross. Seventeen counties were missed by one of the seven county mavens, with such large counties as Summit and Stark making the list.

The Ohio single operator category was once again led by Bob Haynes, KW8N, of North Ridgeville in Lorain county. His 970 qsos is a new single operator high, though the 2010 record score of K8O/K2KW remains on the books. Jim Galm, W8WTS, activated the K8AZ superstation in Geauga county to win the low power category. Hank Greeb, N8XX, a long time Cincinnati resident now living in Michigan, came south to operate QRP as K6JSS from the Glacier Ridge Metro Park in Union county, and took Ohio's QRP honors for the third straight year.

OQP Chairman Jim Stahl, K8MR, this year went out mobile with Gary Mikitin, AF8A, and came home with the top mobile score. In the Rover class, the N9FN crew from Lafayette, IN, joined us in western Ohio and came out on top in the category. The multioperator team at K8DV in Clermont county not only won but also set a new record in that category.

The single mode plaques went to Tom Hain, KV8Q, from Franklin county on CW, and to Scott Gordon, NT8Z of Delaware county, on SSB. Note that to win a single mode plaque you do not have to operate exclusively on that mode; NT8Z also made 50 qsos on CW which greatly helped his overall score.

This year there is no plaque for the top club, as we have noticed that very often clubs no longer have a physical place to keep or display them. But we congratulate the Delaware Amateur Radio Association, who turned out the most entries and the winning score among Ohio clubs.

From outside Ohio, Tennessee's Steve Woods, NA4K, who has previously won the Low Power OhQP plaque, this year entered with high power and took the honors. Dave Pruet, K8CC, earned the low power award this year. In the QRP category, Maryland's Curt Milton, WB8YYY, was the QRP winner. Operating contests like the OhQP from the west coast can be a challenge, but Bill Waters, W7GKF, rose to the task and will receive one of our beautiful plaques for his effort. And finally, from outside the USA and Canada, Andreas Gille, DL3GA, won the plaque for the top DX entry.

NEW FOR 2013!

Matt Welch, W8DEC, Ohio's ARRL Section Emergency Coordinator, approached us last fall about adding an emergency communications aspect to the Ohio QSO Party. After discussions with Matt, for 2013 we're adding a new category, for Emergency Operation Center (EOC) stations. It will be open to operations from any established EOC in Ohio, which may use any number of operators and transmitters, and will be scored as any other entry. There will be no special credit or bonuses for working an EOC, just work and log them as any regular station. There will be a plaque awarded to the top EOC entry, sponsored by the Radio Society of Ohio, K8RSO.

We hope this will give EOC stations a good workout for their stations, and get lots of new blood into the OhQP!

RESULTS UPDATE

After the results were published in March, going through log checking results for individual stations, we discovered that the new DX multiplier for Ohio stations had not been reflected in the published scores. The scores have been revised to include that multiplier. So the good news is, that for most people their scores increased. (And did not go down – just remained the same if you had not worked a DX station). Given the finite time and energy of the report writer, the score list by Ohio county was not updated. (So you can see your old score there).

ABOUT LOGS

OhQP log checking is done by Tim Mitchell, K9TM. Tim is in a sense a professional log checker: along with K8CC (this year's low power out of state winner) he does the log checking for the ARRL 10 meter and 160 meter contests. A good part of log checking has typically involved massaging various computer generated logs into the proper format. To simplify this work Tim, also the OhQP web guru, developed a web based log submission system that debuted for 2012. Many of you used it up front, and those who emailed logs received requests to resubmit via the web. The web system checks the logs for proper electronic format, and for matching of information (about category, QTH, etc.) submitted with information contained in the log. It may have taken you several tries to get things right (one common error was leaving a default QTH of OH in the logged exchange, rather than your county), but we appreciate you having used this system, which speeded up and made log checking more accurate. And thanks to K9TM for his fine work in creating this system.

Look for a new hand at that. Ev Jackson, WZ8P, of the Franklin Printing Co. of Zanesville, handles the beautiful plaques we award the winners. And finally, OhQP committee members K1LT and AF8A end up with the odd jobs.
